An Ordinance making final cumulative annual appropriations for current expenses and other expenditures of the City of Mansfield, Ohio, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2022, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That, in accordance with the budgetary procedures timetable adopted pursuant to Resolution #88-212, passed July 5, 1988, and the appropriations set forth in Ordinance #21-226 (temporary appropriations), passed December 21, 2021, the sums set forth in the attached pages numbered 1 through 31 are incorporated herein and are hereby adopted and appropriated by classification as the final cumulative annual appropriations to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the City of Mansfield, Ohio, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2022, and any sums heretofore appropriated for 2022 are chargeable to and included in appropriations made herein.

SECTION 2. That being final cumulative annual appropriations which are essential to the ongoing fiscal operation of the City from and after January 1, 2022, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Authorizing the Interim Safety-Service Director to enter into an agreement with the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation to facilitate the effective reutilization of nonproductive land within Richland County through the demolition of abandoned structures, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation was formally recognized as an incorporated entity within the State of Ohio on November 18, 2013 and is a County Land Reutilization Corporation created pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Chapters 1702 and 1724 and exercises the powers granted to it under chapters 1724 and 5722, and

WHEREAS, the City and the Corporation wish to enter into a new agreement which is attached as Exhibit "A".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITYOF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Interim Safety-Service Director be, and he is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement to allow the City of Mansfield to facilitate the effective reutilization of nonproductive land within Richland County through the demolition of abandoned structures, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof, available on file in the Clerk of Council, with the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation, to allow the City of Mansfield to facilitate the effective reutilization of nonproductive land within Richland County through the demolition of abandoned structures.

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 6th day of April, 2022, by and between Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation ("Corporation"), and City of Mansfield, Ohio ("City").

WHEREAS, the Corporation is a County Land Reutilization Corporation created pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") Chapters 1702 and 1724 and exercises the powers granted under chapters 1724 and 5722 in order to facilitate the effective reutilization of non-productive land within Richland County's ("County") boundaries and was formally recognized as an incorporated entity within the State of Ohio on November 18, 2013; and

WHEREAS the Board of Directors of the Corporation, per Resolution adopted on April 30, 2014 has authority to make, prescribe and enforce all rules and regulations for the conduct of the business and affairs of the Corporation and the management and control of its properties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to ORC 735.05 and 1724.02(A) (10) (16) the City desires to engage the Corporation to provide services for the City related to the day to day business and affairs of their demolition program;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Services to be Performed; Term. The Corporation agrees to provide the services described on Schedule 1 attached hereto. The services shall be timely provided. Time is of the essence.
 - a. <u>Term of Agreement</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be for the period commencing on the date of approval by the City's Council and ending on January 31, 2024.
 - b. <u>Corporation's Compensation</u>. Corporation's office will be compensated for items listed in Schedule 1 and 2 plus any other expenses specified in writing and approved by the City.
 - c. Invoices submitted to the City by the 1st of each month will be paid by the 30th of that month provided that neither the invoice nor the amount owed is disputed by the City.
- 2. Compensation. The City shall pay to the Corporation actual documented expenses incurred plus administration, cost analysis and environment survey cost as outlined in Schedule 2. Such compensation structure shall be by mutual agreement of the Corporation and the City and shall be reduced to writing and attached as an amendment hereto. City shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred per demolition project.
- 3. Expenses. The City shall reimburse the Corporation for all reasonable and acceptable documented expenses incurred by the Corporation in providing the services outlined in

- Schedule 1. Any expenses not listed must have prior approval of the City. Corporation shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred per demolition project.
- 4. Independent Contractor. The Corporation and the City expressly acknowledge and agree that the services to be provided by the Corporation under this Agreement shall be performed as an independent contractor, and not as an agent, employee, joint venture or partner of the City. The parties also expressly acknowledge and agree that with respect to any payments made to the Corporation hereunder, unless otherwise provided herein, the City shall not: (i) withhold or pay FICA, Medicare or other federal, state or local income or other taxes or charges; or (ii) comply with or contribute to state worker's compensation, unemployment or other such governmental funds or programs.
- 5. Termination of Services. This Agreement shall terminate upon the occurrence of any of the following events:
 - A. The City fails to pay the Corporation any amount due hereunder within thirty (30) days after notice from the City that the money is past due; or
 - B. If, in the reasonable determination of a party, the other party has materially defaulted in the performance of this Agreement, or materially breaches any of its provisions; or
 - C. Upon thirty (30) days written notice by the City to the Corporation; or upon thirty (30) days written notice by the Corporation to the City; or
 - D. Immediately upon the mutual agreement of both parties.
- 6. Work Product. All reports or other materials prepared by the Corporation during the term of the contract shall become the property of the City.
- 7. Return of City Property. The Corporation agrees that he will not use any City property for its personal gain or in any manner that might be adverse to the City's interests. At any time upon the City's demand and in any event on or before the termination date, the Corporation will return to the City all the City property that is in Corporation's possession, custody, or control. After the termination of this Agreement, the Corporation will return to the City any City property that comes into Corporations possession, custody, or control.
- 8. Notice. Any notice, election, request or demand required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepared or received by overnight courier, and addressed to the party at the address listed below:

15. Construction. The parties acknowledge that each party has reviewed this Agreement and that the normal rule of construction that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not be employed in the interpretation of this Agreement and any modification or amendment thereto.

 - i. Chattel letter
 - ii. Waiver
 - iii. Appeal form
 - iv. Envelopes
 - a. Give prepared orders to Department of Codes and Permits for review, signatures, and postage.
 - b. Run legal ad (if required).
- 13. After project legislation has been approved:
 - a. Prepare bid documents
 - b. Send notice to contractors via e-mail
 - c. Publish notice to contractors in local newspaper (if necessary)
 - d. Conduct pre-bid meetings (if necessary)
 - e. Conduct bid opening
 - f. Prepare contract between City and Demolition Contractor
 - i. Give prepared contract to Department of Codes and Permits
- 14. Provide certification requested as shown in Attachment 1.
- 15. Submit itemized invoice for services.

Repealing Chapter 1361 - Stormwater Management of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997 and enacting Chapter 1361 - Stormwater Management, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, currently, the Mansfield Codified Ordinances provide for the establishment of certain rules and regulations relating to stormwater management, and

WHEREAS, the City finds it beneficial to the needs of the community to update and revise said Section.

NOW, THREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 1361 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997, authorizing the establishment of certain rules and regulations relating to stormwater management, be and the same is hereby, repealed.

SECTION 2. That Chapter 1361 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997, be, and the same is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 1361 Stormwater Management

1361.01 AUTHORITY AND TITLE.

This Chapter has been developed under authority of Article XVIII, Section 3 of the Ohio Constitution.

The official title of these rules shall be known as the "City of Mansfield, Ohio Stormwater Management Rules and Regulations." However, simply "Stormwater Rule and Regulations" may be used as a short title.

1361.02 PURPOSE

Council has adopted this chapter for the purpose of establishing feasible and economically reasonable standards to achieve a level of management and conservation practices which will abate erosion of the soil and abate the degradation of the water of the State by soil sediment in conjunction with nonfarm, earth-disturbing activities.

It is the further intent of this chapter to:

- (a) Permit development without increasing downstream flooding, erosion or sedimentation.
- (b) Reduce damage to receiving streams and impairment of their capacity which may be caused by increases in the quantity and/or rate of water discharged.
- (c) Establish a basis for design of all storm drainage systems which will preserve the rights and options of both the dominant and servient property owners and help assure the long-term adequacy of storm drainage systems.

1361.03 ADOPTION OF "CITY OF MANSFIELD STORMWATER DESIGN MANUAL".

(a) Subject to the provisions set forth in this chapter, the City of Mansfield hereby adopts the "City of Mansfield Stormwater Design Manual" which provides policy, standards, applicability, criteria, requirements, recommendations and guidance for general stormwater drainage, stormwater quantity, and stormwater quality management in the City of Mansfield that are not provided explicitly in this chapter.

A copy of the "City of Mansfield Stormwater Design Manual" is hereby referenced and adopted as part of this chapter.

(b) The City Engineer is authorized to amend, supplement or revise the "City of Mansfield Stormwater Design Manual." The City of Mansfield Stormwater Design Manual, shall be made available in the

Office of the City Engineering Department, and may be updated and expanded from time to time, at the discretion of the City Engineering Department, based on improvements in the engineering, science, monitoring, local maintenance experience, and federal and state regulations.

(c) At a minimum, the "City of Mansfield Stormwater Design Manual" shall meet the technical requirements set forth in the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency NPDES general stormwater permit(s) for construction activities and any subsequent Ohio Environmental Protection Agency issued permits.

1361.04 SCOPE.

This chapter shall apply to all earth-disturbing activities and projects adding impervious area as indicated within the Stormwater Design Manual.

-1361.05 WAIVERS.

— Certain earth-disturbing activities may exist such the submission of a stormwater management plan serves

no real-purpose. Such activity shall be eligible for waiver from the requirement of submitting a plan and/or

other requirements of this chapter.

To obtain a waiver, a person shall submit a written request to the Bureau of Building, Inspections, Licenses and Permits. This request shall include sufficient data to determine that granting a waiver will not result in excessive stormwater runoff or rate of runoff.

1361.05-6 PLAN REVIEW.

All stormwater management plans and runoff calculations shall be submitted to the Bureau of Buildings, Inspection, Licenses and Permits. The Office of the City Engineer shall review the stormwater management plan and runoff calculations within thirty days of the receipt and indicate its approval or disapproval t the person who filed the plan. Indication of disapproval shall include the plan deficiencies and the procedure for filing a revised plan. Pending preparation and approval of the revised plan, earth-disturbing activities shall not be allowed until deficiencies have been properly addressed and an acceptable plan has been filed and approved by the City Planning Commission the Office of the City Engineer.

The Office of the City Engineer shall be responsible for the construction inspection of all stormwater management facilities.

1361.06 7 PERMITS.

Any person performing any nonfarm, earth disturbing activities that disturbs 20,000 square feet or more impervious area or performance of earth-disturbing activities as indicated within the Stormwater Design Manual shall be required to file a stormwater management plan and obtain a stormwater management permit.

Permit application forms shall be made available in the Bureau of Buildings, Inspections, Licenses and Permits. Information required shall be sufficient for the Bureau to determine if a stormwater management plan is necessary and that the person intends to comply with this chapter. At a minimum, the application shall include the following:

- (a) Name, address and phone number of the property owner and/or other person responsible for the activity.
- (b) Location of the activity.
- (c) Description of the activity.
 - (1) Type of activity.
 - (2) Area to be disturbed.
 - (3) Area to be rendered permanently impervious.
 - (4) Size of parcel or lot on which activities will occur.

The Bureau shall review the permit application and if no stormwater management plan is required, an application shall be made to the Zoning Administration for a zoning certificate in accordance with Section 1155.03.

In the event that a plan is required, the permit shall be issued upon approval by the City Planning Commission.

1361.078 FEES.

(a) Permit Fee: A permit fee in the amount of fifty-five dollars (\$55.00) shall be paid to the Bureau of Buildings, Inspections, Licenses and Permits upon submission of an application.

No permit fee shall be required for the following: Nonfarm, earth-disturbing activities which have been provided for in an already approved stormwater management plan. (Example: home construction on a lot in an approved subdivision with an approved stormwater management plan).

(b) Plan Review and Field Inspection Fees: A fee in the amount of two-hundred dollars (\$200.00) shall be paid to the Bureau of Buildings, Inspections, Licenses and Permits before issuance of the stormwater management permit to offset the cost of plan review and field inspection of such construction to assure its conformance with the plans.

1361.08 9 ASSURANCE OF COMPLETION.

The Bureau of Buildings, Inspections, Licenses and Permits shall not issue a Certificate of Occupancy until the stormwater management facilities have been constructed in accordance with the appropriate stormwater management plan and have been approved by the Office of the City Engineer.

Stormwater management facilities that are being constructed as part of a subdivision subject to the Subdivision Regulations of the City shall be considered and improvement. As such they shall be subject to the bonding requirements therein. The value of the stormwater management facilities shall be included in the amount of the performance bond for the subdivision improvements.

If it can be shown that assurance of completion is being provided through another regulation of this City or other governmental subdivisions, this section of the Stormwater Management Regulations shall be waived.

1361. 19 10 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY.

Neither submission of a plan under provisions of the chapter nor compliance with provisions of this chapter shall relieve any person from responsibility for damage to any person property otherwise imposed by law, nor impose any liability upon the City for damage to any person or property.

1361.11 SURVEILLANCE AND COMPLIANCE.

The Office of the City Engineer shall inspect land disturbance areas during construction to determine compliance with the chapter. If it is determined that a violation of this chapter exists, the responsible person shall be notified of the deficiencies or noncompliance by the Office of the City Engineer in writing and by certified mail. If after fourteen (14) days after receipt of the letter for compliance, the deficiency or noncompliance has not been corrected or substantial steps taken to correct same, such deficiency or noncompliance shall be reported to the law director for legal action.

1361. 10-12 MAINTENANCE OF STORMWATER DRAINAGE FACILITIESAND CONTROL STRUCTURES

When stormwater management facilities and control structures are located on private property, it is the private post-construction operator's/developer's responsibility to inspect and properly maintain the

facilities. In addition, an Operation and Maintenance Plan shall be developed and implemented in accordance with the Stormwater Design Manual. The maintenance of minor detention in areas such as swales, etc. on individual parcels or lots in new subdivisions shall be the responsibility of the individual parcel or lot owners. Special provisions shall be written into the deeds for the individual parcels or lots in new subdivisions, so the owners are aware that the parcels or lots are used for temporary stormwater storage. The City shall require all of the stormwater drainage facilities and control structures to be designed to minimize maintenance costs.

1361.1 3-RIGHT OF ACCESS

The City of Mansfield shall be permitted to enter and inspect facilities subject to this regulation as often as may be necessary to determine compliance with this regulation.

1361.12 ENFORCEMENT

- (a) If the City of Mansfield or its duly authorized representative determines that a violation of the rules adopted under this code exists, the City of Mansfield or representative may issue an immediate stop work order if the violator failed to obtain any federal, state, or local permit necessary for sediment and erosion control, earth movement, clearing, or cut and fill activity.
- (b) All development areas may be subject to external inspections by the City Engineer and/or designee to ensure compliance with the regulation.
- (c) After each external inspection, the City Engineer and/or designee shall prepare and distribute a status report to the applicant.
- (d) If an external inspection determines that the operations are being conducted in violation of any of the provisions of this regulation the City Engineer and/or designee may take action as detailed in Section 1361.13 of this regulation.

1361 13 VIOLATIONS

- (a) No person shall violate or cause or knowingly permit to be violated any of the provisions of this regulation or fail to comply with any of such provisions or with any lawful requirements of any public authority made pursuant to this regulation, or knowingly use or cause or permit the use of any lands in violation of this regulation or in violation of any permit granted under this regulation.
- (b) Upon notice, the City Engineer and/or designee may suspend any active soil disturbing activity for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days and may require immediate erosion and sediment control measures whenever he or she determines that such activity is not meeting the intent of this regulation. Such notice shall be in writing, shall be given to the applicant, and shall state the conditions under which work may be resumed. In instances, where the City Engineer and/or designee finds that the immediate action is necessary for public safety or the public interest, he or she may require that work be stopped upon verbal order pending issuance of the written notice.
- (c) Notice of Violation: Whenever the City finds that a person has violated a prohibition or failed to meet a requirement of this Chapter, the City may order compliance by written notice of violation to the owner and/or occupant. Such notice may require without limitation:
 - Specific details about the violation;
 - (2) Violating discharges, practices, or operations shall cease and desist:
 - (3) Specific details about the elimination of illicit connections or discharges;
 - (4) The abatement or remediation of stormwater pollution or contamination hazards and the restoration of any affected property;
 - (5) The timeframe within which the violator must cure any deficiencies;
 - (6) In addition to any other monetary penalties set forth in these regulations, the owner and/or occupant shall reimburse the City for the time expended by its representatives and the City shall further be reimbursed any remediation costs via an administrative fee and costs passed through to the owner;
 - (7) The implementation of source control or treatment Sediment Control Measures; and,

The performance of monitoring, analyses, and reporting required.

- (d) If it is determined that a violation of this Chapter exists fourteen (14) days following the notice of violation, the responsible person shall be notified of the deficiencies or noncompliance and stop work order by the Office of the City Engineer in writing and by certified mail. Upon issuance of the final letter for noncompliance and stop work order, the deficiencies or noncompliance shall be
- (e) Abatement: If abatement of a violation and/or restoration of affected property is required, the notice shall set forth a deadline within which such remediation or restoration must be completed. Said notice shall further advise that, should the violator fail to remediate or restore within the established deadline, the works will be completed by a designated governmental agency or contractor of the City's choosing and the expenses thereof, including actual City representatives time, shall be charged to the violator.

1361 14 APPEALS

Any person aggrieved by any order, requirement, determination, or any other action or inaction by the City of Mansfield in relation to this regulation may appeal to the City Planning Commission or Court of Common Pleas Written notice of appeal shall be served on the City of Mansfield.

1361.99 PENALTY

Violation of the provisions of this chapter or failure to comply with any of its requirements shall constitute a minor misdemeanor. Whoever violated any provision of his chapter or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall be fined not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense.

Each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the City from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation."

In order to provide for proper and effective management of stormwater, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in forced immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

SECTION 2. That Chapter 1362 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997, be, and the same is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 1362 Stormwater Erosion and Sediment Control

1362.01 AUTHORITY AND TITLE.

This Chapter has been developed under authority of Article XVIII, Section 3 of the Ohio Constitution.

The official title of these rules shall be known as the "City of Mansfield, Ohio Stormwater Erosion and Sediment Control Rules and Regulations." However, simply "Stormwater Erosion and Sediment Control Rule and Regulations" may be used as a short title.

1362.02 PURPOSE.

Council has adopted this chapter for the purpose of establishing feasible and economically reasonable standards to achieve a level of conservation practices which will abate erosion of the soil and abate the degradation of the waters of the State by soil sediment in conjunction with nonfarm, earth-disturbing activities.

1362.03 DIRECTION.

No person shall cause or allow earth-disturbing activities on a development area except in compliance with the criteria established by the regulations contained in this chapter.

1362.04 EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL DURNG CONSTRUCTION.

(a) When a proposed development involves 1 acre or more of earth-disturbing activities and performed on land used or land being developed for commercial industrial, residential, recreational, public service or other nonfarm purposes which are within the jurisdiction of the City, the owner of record shall develop and submit to the Bureau of Buildings Inspections, Licenses and Permits a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan.

For development involving less than one acre of earth-disturbing activities, but is part of the larger common plan of developing or sale that will ultimately disturb one or more acres of land, the owner of record shall develop and submit to the Bureau of Buildings, Inspections, Licenses and Permits a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan.

The erosion and sediment controls and the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan including all construction activities shall at a minimum meet the technical requirements set forth in the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency NPDES General Stormwater Permit(s) for construction activities and any subsequent Ohio Environmental Protection agency issued permits.

No earth-disturbing activities shall commence prior to the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan being filed, reviewed and approved by the City Engineer. and approved by the City Planning Commission.

(b) In the event that any person has disturbed less than 1 acre of earth and such disturbances are creating a quisance to abutting properties and/or entering the City's infrastructure or public right-of-way, the City reserves the right to require erosion and sediment controls to be established in accordance with Chapter 1362 of the City of Mansfield Codified Ordinances and enforcement per Chapter 1362.06.

When a proposed development involving earth disturbing activities less than 1 acre, a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan is not required. However, the owner of record shall comply with the other General Requirements and Provision to prevent sediment pollution from occurring.

1362.05 NOTIFICATION.

The Office of the City Engineer Bureau of Buildings, Inspections, License and Permits shall be notified two (2) working days prior to commencement of earth-disturbing activities. The Office of the City Engineer Bureau of Buildings Inspections, Licenses and Permits shall also be notified upon project completion.

1362.06 ENFORCEMENT

(a) If the City of Mansfield and/or its duly authorized representative determines that a violation of the rules adopted under this code exist, the City of Mansfield and/or representative may issue an immediate stop work order if the violator failed to obtain any federal, state, or local permit necessary for sediment and erosion control, earth movement, clearing, or cut and fill activity.
 (b) All development areas may be subject to external inspections by the City Engineer and/or designee to ensure compliance with the approved Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan.
 (c) After each external inspection, the City Engineer and/or designee shall prepare and distribute a status report to the applicant.

(d) If an external inspection determines that operations are being conducted in violation of the approved Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan, the City Engineer and/or designee may take action as detailed in Section 1362.07 of this Chapter

(e) Failure to install, maintain, and repair erosion and sediment controls per the approved Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan may result in the following escalation:

(1) First Violation: The City Engineer and or/designee will issue a Notice of Deficiency to the owner or operator. All controls are to be repaired or maintain per the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan within three (3) days of the notification. If controls have not been corrected after this time, the City Engineer and/or designee may issue a Stop Work Order for all activities until corrections have been made.

(2) Second Violation: The City Engineer and/or designee may issue a formal Notice of Violation. All controls are to be repaired or maintained per the approved Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan with three (3) days of the Notice of Violation. If controls have not been corrected after this time, the City Engineer and/or designee may issue a Stop Work Order for all activities until corrections have been made.

(3) Third and Subsequent Violations: The City Engineer may issue a Stop Work Order for all construction activities. The Stop Work Order will be lifted once all controls are in

compliance with the approved Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan.

(f) The City Engineer and/or designee shall have the final authority to make immediate on-site adjustments to the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan. In order to achieve compliance with this ordinance.

(g) A final inspection will be made to determine if the criteria of this code has been satisfied and a report will be presented to the City of Mansfield on the site's compliance status.

(h) The City Engineer and/or designee will monitor soil-disturbing activities for nonfarm residential, commercial, industrial, or other nonfarm purposes on land of less than one contiguous acre to ensure compliance required by these Rules.

1362.07 VIOLATIONS

- (a) No person shall violate or cause or knowingly permit to be violated any of the provisions of this regulation or fail to comply with any of such provisions or with any lawful requirements of any public authority made pursuant to this regulation, or knowingly use or cause or permit the use of any lands in violation of this regulation or in violation of any permit granted under this regulation.
- (b) Upon notice, the City Engineer and/or designee may suspend any active soil disturbing activity for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, and may require immediate erosion and sediment control measures whenever he or she determines that such activity is not meeting the intent of this regulation Sch notice shall be in writing, shall be given to the applicant, and shall state the conditions under which work may be resumed. In instances, however, where the City Engineer and/or designee finds that immediate action is necessary for the public interest, he or she may require that work be stopped upon verbal order pending issuance of the written notice (c) Notice of Violation: Whenever the City finds that a person has violated a prohibition or failed to meet a requirement of this Chapter, the City may order compliance by written notice of violation to the owner and/or occupant. Such notice may require without limitation.
 - (1) Specific details about the violation;
 - (2) That violating discharges, practices, or operations shall cease and desist,
 - (3) Specific details about the elimination of illicit connections or discharges;
 - (4) The abatement or remediation of stormwater pollution or contamination hazards and the restoration of any affected property;
 - (5) The timeframe within which the violator must cure any deficiencies;
 - (6) In addition to any other monetary penalties set forth in these regulations, the owner and/or occupant shall reimburse the City for the time expended by its representatives and the City shall further be reimbursed any remediation costs via an administrative fee and costs passed through to the owners
 - (7) The implementation of source control or treatment Sediment Control Measures; and,
- (8) The performance of monitoring, analyses, and reporting required. (d) Abatement: If abatement of a violation and/or restoration of affected property is required, the notice shall set forth a deadline within which such remediation or restoration must be completed

Said notice shall further advise that, should the violator fail to remediate or restore within the established deadline the work will be completed by a designated governmental agency or a

contractor of the City's choosing and the expense thereof, including actual City representatives time, shall be charged to the violator

1362,08 APPEALS

Any person aggrieved by any order, requirement, determination, or any other action or inaction by the City of Mansfield in relation to this regulation may appeal to the City Planning Commission or Court of Common Pleas Written notice of appeal shall be served on the City of Mansfield

1362.99 PENALTY

Violation of the provisions of this chapter or failure to comply with any of its requirements shall constitute a minor misdemeanor. Whoever violates this chapter or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall be fined not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense. Each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the City from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation."

SECTION 3. In order to provide for proper and effective management of stormwater erosion and sediment control, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in forced immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
