

REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
September 21, 2021

The second monthly meeting of Mansfield City Council met on
Tuesday, September 21, 2021 at 8:28 PM in the
Council Chambers of the City Building.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by the audience.

Councilman Lawrence led the audience in prayer.

ROLL CALL: The following answered present at roll call: Burns, Meier, Van Harlingen, Davenport, Lawrence, Moton, Zader, Scott and Falquette.

There being no objections, the reading of the Journal and Correspondence was dispensed with.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: We've already had public comment. Are there any committee reports? Mr. Mayor, would you like to address council?

MAYOR THEAKER: No, Mr. President I have nothing.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Safety Service Director Cope address council?

DIRECTOR COPE: Yes Mr. President I have something briefly.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you.

DIRECTOR COPE: I was given two packets for safety forces for thanks from Mrs. Stoltz 5th and 6th grade social studies class at Mansfield Christian. And just briefly I wanted to read. It's important to me that we recognize that really what we're doing here is for our future and these children see what we do and it's impactful to them. The one sent a note just saying "Thank you helping my mom when she needed it most and thank you for saving our life instead of your own". That's sort of how that child saw it. The other is saying quoting of course Joshua 1:9, "Have I not commanded you be strong and courageous do not be afraid for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" and he says "I hope this encourages our police and fire to keep doing what they do". So, I just think you know, thank you to them for taking the time and all that they put these packets together and to just recognize that.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you for sharing, very much appreciate it. Public Works Director Remy?

DIRECTOR REMY: Nothing sir.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you sir. And the Law Director, Mr. Brown?

DIRECTOR BROWN: No thank you.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: All right.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Is there any discussion on bill 21-144? Mr. Van Harlingen.

DISCUSSION:

JON VAN HARLINGEN: Thank you, Mr. President. I was planning on this evening, we have a letter that was cc to Mansfield City Council from the Ohio EPA, notice of violation. I was considering it might be worth going through and looking at that tonight along with some other things. But in the light of the monies that we are receiving and is being recommended by the administration, by the Mayor. I think I would like to postpone some of this information until maybe we get to the budget hearings. It might be more appropriate.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you Mr. Van Harlingen. Mr. Davenport.

ALOMAR DAVENPORT: Yes, I just want to emphasize the significance of what the Administration has done with the American Rescue Plan and the impact that it will have on this particular bill. Everyone on council, at one point or another, has expressed support for this dry dam. The big concern has been the finances and I recognize that concern is legitimate. But anytime you make an investment and that's what this is. This is not an expenditure, it's an investment. And anytime you make an investment there's inherent risk that is involved, there is a fear that comes with that. The scariness that comes with that. Those who have been successful and say the finance world break through that fear and make the investment that is necessary to come out the other end in a better form. And that is what we're trying to do here. So, I do want to emphasize the significance of the money that is being allocated to the different sewer projects. I do want to recognize the concerns there, but I also want to ask council to break through that fear that we have and at some point, decide that we here in Mansfield are going to invest in our future. And we can begin that process by voting yes on this measure.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you Mr. Davenport. Mrs. Zader.

STEPHANIE ZADER: I'd like to Echo what council in Davenport has said. I think that while this is a big project, we have to remember we're not deciding on the entire project tonight. Or deciding on getting the engineering completed so that we can go after funding for the rest of the project. This is a significant investment. We've heard from a lot of members of the community in support of it. Everything that I've heard has been in support of it. The citizens want this, the community leaders want this. Because they know the impact that this will have in the long-term in our community. And that is what investment is. Councilman Davenport is right, that's investment. Investment is when you see a return on what you're doing. We will see a return on this, there's no doubt about that. The impact that this flooding is having on that area of town is dire. We talked about the GIS mapping System earlier today. I sat down with our city engineer, who we hired because he's an expert, to tell us how to solve issues in our city. He's telling us this is the resolution. This will help solve this. When I sat down and looked at that GIS mapping system, it really had an impact on me. It was probably the biggest deciding factor in my support of this. Watching the pure decimation of that area of town. Buildings just disappearing off of the map, Homes disappearing. These are places where people raise their families. Where they went to work to provide for those families. And they just disappeared. I don't think that we should take that lightly. I think that we need to invest in our community.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you Mrs. Zader. Mr. Lawrence.

JASON LAWRENCE: You know that I have been a huge proponent of this dam. And I thank everybody for getting it to this point. I also want to thank the Matterns for coming back and bringing it to our attention. Bringing this forward, moving it forward, going out talking with them. Understanding what flood insurance is and the burden that is on people and so I'm grateful that we are moving this forward tonight and then we will be voting to move our city forward. Thank you.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Mr. Van Harlingen.

JON VAN HARLINGEN: I know during comment, here a couple weeks ago, I asked Mr. Bobby if he would have the estimates. Basically, what kind of funds were talking now. 2 and 1/2 years ago we were talking 1.5 million for the engineering and 15.5 for the dam. Here we are 2 and 1/2 years later. Do we have, is Mr. Bianchi still here, have a rough estimate of what are engineering costs are going to be?

BOB BIANCHI: Of course, the details have to be worked out on the engineering agreement, but we're estimating 1.6 million for the engineering contract to design and work through all the permitting process with the EPA and ODNR. So, it's a two-year long process broken up into two phases. First phase \$800,000, second phase \$800,000.

JON VAN HARLINGEN: So were kind of guesstimating at 10% the dam somewhere around 16 million.

BOB BIANCHI: 16 to 18 million, but of course it's depending on when the dam would be constructed as we all know.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Alright, Mr. Van Harlingen would you like to make the final motion to move this all the way to a vote?

JON VAN HARLINGEN: Thank you Mr. President I move bill 21-144 be placed upon the floor for final consideration.

STEPHANIE ZADER: Second.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Been moved and seconded for final consideration of bill 21-144. Please cast your vote. Motion passes 8 to 0. With that Mr. Van Harlingen.

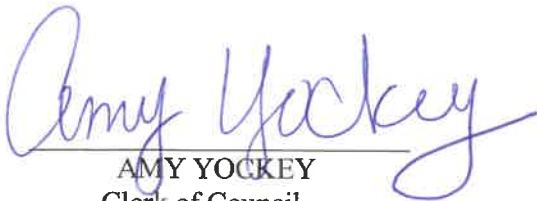
PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Been moved and seconded. All those in favor say aye.
