REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING January 3, 2023

The first monthly meeting of Mansfield City Council met on Tuesday January 3, 2023 at 7:51 pm in the Council Chambers of the City Building.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by the audience.

Eleazer Akuchie led the audience in prayer.

ROLL CALL: The following answered present at roll call: Burns, Meier (excused absent 7-0), Akuchie, Davenport, Diaz, Moton, Zader, Scott, and Falquette.

There being no objections, the reading of the Journal and Correspondence was dispensed with.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: And we have three people signed up this evening to speak before council. First up is Mr. Miller on Coleman Road. If you can state your name and your address and we have 3 minutes per person tonight. There's a button in the middle of that stand, yep you got it.

ERIC MILLER: Hi Mary Miller and I live at 693 Coleman Road in Mansfield, Rev. El Akuchie's ward. And I'm here to urge you to vote for the water rate increase that has been discussed in Council. And you folks have all received two letters from me concerning this matter. And...and, so we need to assure a safe and reliable delivery of water to our citizens and that has to begin with passing the rate increase. Now we currently pay less than a nickel a gallon for water and sewer and after the rate increase goes through it will still be less than a nickel a gallon. Now that's mighty low and that's a low price for something we have to have. Now if you look at what bottled water costs and that's if you're buying it by the...by the skid load, a skid of gallon bottles, two bucks a gallon if you have to buy your water...your bottled water.

Now I know some of you are holding back because you have questions about whether or not there's an unjustified delay in installing new water meters. Water meters might be a problem, I wouldn't claim to know about that. But sometimes you have to solve more than one problem at a time. You can't hold up this rate increase because you have concerns about water meter installation. You have to assess the risk of a massive catastrophe and we're playing that game by risking a total shutdown of the water system. A total loss of pressure over an extended area. We have old pipes that rely on internal pressure to resist the force of gravity. And if those pipes drain out and we lose pressure you could have pipes that, currently aren't leaking, that crack and start to leak. And that means that when the water is finally back on you still have a huge problem. Including pollutants that enter in these cracked pipes that lay there for perhaps days at a time. Again, I know a lot of you are holding out because you have constituents who are worried about any increase in any of their bills. And that's a tough thing for them to go through I'm sure, but if they have to go without water it's two bucks a gallon, minimum, if someone else is delivering it for them on a pallet. That's 40 nickels a gallon.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Mr. Miller you're not quite out of time but your real close.

ERIC MILLER: ...ok, that's 40 nickels a gallon and it's hard to come up with that many nickels if you've lost your job because your employer has closed because he doesn't have water. Okay, Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you Mr. Miller. And the other names I don't see in the audience anymore. So we have no one else to speak before council. Are there any committee reports? Mr. Mayor?

MAYOR THEAKER: No Mr. President, I have nothing.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Mr. Safety Service Director?

DIRECTOR REMY: I have nothing, sir.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Mr. Assistant Law Director?

CHRIS BROWN: The only thing I would say is just thank the public for their patience while we adjourn into executive session. So, thank you.

END OF DISCUSSION

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you Mr. Brown. Alright, let's proceed with legislation. Mrs. Burns do we have any late bills?

LATE BILLS

LAURA BURNS: No sir we do not.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Alright, how about suspending rules?

SUSPEND RULES

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Thank you. Are there any questions or comments? Mrs. Burns.

DISCUSSION:

LAURA BURNS: Thank you Mr. President I would like to propose that we, once again, table this until February 7th so that all members of the committee may be present. I meant motion. I meant motion.

STEPHANIE ZADER: Second.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: So were postponing until we can vote on February.

LAURA BURNS: Yes. I hope you all appreciated my word salad here. I apologize.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: That's ok but we've had multiple discussions about the exact word to use. And as long as there's a date, it seems to be pretty pertinent. Alright, so there is a motion without a second.

STEPHANIE ZADER: I seconded it.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Oh, thank you. Mrs. Zader did second it. There's a motion and a second to push this to February 7th for a vote. There's further discussion? Mr. Rev. El Akuchie

REV. EL AKUCHIE: I'm kind of curious as to what impact this will make on the Engineers financial situation if we postpone it till February. If Bobby can help us.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: We can certainly let him answer. I think he's trying to generate \$3.6 million dollars this year and we've lost one month already.

REV. EL AKUCHIE: Yea, can you help us?

ROBERT BIANCHI: So originally, we had planned for December 6th. Then it was moved to January. And then also I think this will be a part of the discussion, maybe next meeting. But currently there is an "and declaring an emergency clause", and I wanted to make sure with the law office that that was acceptable. Cause if that clause is not acceptable for this legislation, then we're talking...now if you...if it's passed in February 7th, it goes into effect March 7th. Which then it takes, based on the cycles of the of utility collections, it could be you know May 7th. Wait is that right? February, March, yeah...April. April until it really starts to collect. That's four months. So that's about a million dollars, in revenue.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: Is there any further questions for Mr. Bianchi as he's explained that? I don't mean to rush him but I don't want to go over it too many times. Mr. Bianchi if you could push the button we'd appreciate it. Alright, if there's no further comment the motion is on the computer. Yeah, I can see it. There it is! Could you see it on your computers? You can go ahead and vote, right. Did you vote Mr. Diaz?

AURELIO DIAZ: Comment. This is really tough because I really respect and see Mr. Miller's perspective, the facts, the information. Just before I came here, late, I was talking to some folks in the restaurant who are...well not restaurant but the meeting, about the concern with the same thing we're all hearing. Which is people hurting financially. And we've had this discussion for a long time about health and safety with the hydrants, with their drinking water. And I know a lot of people are wanting us to vote for and quit puncing around. But I think that no matter what we do we're going to ultimately not make everybody happy. And that's what my whole point is just to let the public know that we're really, every single one of us up here, are really not taking this lightly. Whether we table it. Whether we not. We are just trying to do what is best. But I think when we are declaring emergency, I really feel it is. So that's just my information or my statement.

PRESIDENT FALQUETTE: And the motion passes to postpone until February 7th vote.
