Imposing a six-month moratorium on the acceptance, consideration, and/or granting of any applications for local licensing approval and/or any zoning, occupancy, or other permits relating to cultivators, processors, or retail dispensaries of marijuana within the City of Mansfield, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, In the November 2023 election, the citizens of the State of Ohio passed Issue 2, which legalized the recreational use of marijuana in Ohio with certain restrictions, which are still being determined, and

WHEREAS, given that the regulations for the recreational use of marijuana are still being determined, City Council believes that six (6) months is a reasonable time to obtain the information it needs to address the use of marijuana within the City and to more accurately determine the regulations that will be approved by the State of Ohio; provided however, Council reserves the right to take legislative action to extend the moratorium if the regulations are not made public within such 270 day period.

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That a temporary moratorium is hereby imposed on the consideration and/or granting of any applications for local licensing approval and any zoning, occupancy, or other permits relating to cultivators, processors, or retail dispensaries of marijuana within the City of Mansfield.

SECTION 2. That the duration of the moratorium shall commence with the passage of this ordinance and shall end, unless extended by City Council for the reasons set forth above, six (6) months after the passage of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. As the act will not become effective until after the passage of the ordinance, City Council recognizes that there are no existing requests for local licensing approval and no zoning, occupancy, or other permits relating to cultivators, processors, or retail dispensaries of marijuana within the City of Mansfield with any vested rights to establish a use covered by this moratorium.

SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this legislation were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were taken in meetings open to the public and in conformance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. That by reason of this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

WHEREAS, the City of Mansfield, Ohio, under the authority of Article XVIII, Section 7 of the Ohio Constitution, adopted a City Charter by a vote of the electors of the City at the general election of November 2, 1982, and

WHEREAS, said City Charter under Article XIV, Amendment of Charter, provides for amendment thereof and requires the election of a Charter Review Commission at four (4) year intervals commencing in November 1987, and

WHEREAS, said Charter Review Commission so elected in November 2023, has made its review of the provisions of the Charter and the operations of the City, all as required under Article XIV of the Charter, and

WHEREAS, said Charter Review Commission, as required, has reported its recommendations for revisions to the Charter upon approval by the majority vote of all members elected to the Commission, and

WHEREAS, Council is required by the Charter to submit any amendments so recommended by the Commission to the voters of the City.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1: That it is hereby determined that there shall be submitted to the electors of the City of Mansfield, Ohio, at the election to be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, during the regular hours of voting on such date as prescribed by general law, the questions of amendment of the Charter of the City of Mansfield, Ohio, with respect to ARTICLE XI, OTHER MUNICIPAL INSTRUMENTALITIES (Section 11.04 Board of Control), to be read as follows.

### ARTICLE XI

### OTHER MUNICIPAL INSTRUMENTALITIES

### Section 11.04 Board of Control.

Except as otherwise provided in division (D) of Section 713.23 and Sections 125.04 and 5513.01 of the Ohio Revised Code, no contract in the department of public service or the department of public safety in excess of twenty-five thousand fifty thousand dollars shall be awarded except on the approval of the board of control of the city, which board shall direct the director of the appropriate department to enter into the contract. The members of the board shall prepare estimates of the revenue and expenditures of their respective departments to be submitted to the city legislative authority by the mayor, as provided by law.

SECTION 2. That the ballots on the questions of the proposed Charter Amendments, as set forth in Section 1 hereof, for said election shall each be substantially in the following form or similar form as approved by the appropriate election authorities to express the intent and purpose hereof:

### OFFICIAL QUESTIONS AND ISSUES BALLOT PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT CITY OF MANSFIELD, OHIO

A Majority Affirmative Vote is Necessary for Passage

SHALL SECTION 11.04 OF THE CHARTER FOR THE CITY OF MANSFIELD BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE A NEW APPROVAL THRESHOLD ON PROJECTS IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

### Section 11.04 Board of Control.

Except as otherwise provided in division (D) of Section 713.23 and Sections 125.04 and 5513.01 of the Ohio Revised Code, no contract in the department of public service or the department of public safety in excess of fifty thousand dollars shall be awarded except on the approval of the board of control of the city, which board shall direct the director of the appropriate department to enter into the contract.

SECTION 3. SECTION 5. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance to the appropriate election authorities.

SECTION 6. That by reason of the immediate necessity for complying with statutory and Charter time schedules for issues to be placed on the ballot in November this year, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Opposing the decommission of the LOM (Locator Outer Marker) and VOR (Very High-Frequency Omni-Directional Range) equipment at the Mansfield Lahm Airport.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That by reason of consultation with the FAA, Mansfield Lahm Airport has received notice of a possible change to the LOM and VOR equipment. The City of Mansfield, Ohio adamantly opposes the decommissioning of this equipment at the Mansfield Lahm Airport.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. With greater specific detail, the City of Mansfield, Ohio states the negative impacts on Mansfield Lahm Airport will be at a minimum:

- 1. The Decommissioning of both the LOM and VOR at Mansfield Lahm Airport would eliminate 3 of the 8 (37.5%) approaches to the Airport.
- 2. FAA suggested decommissioning both the LOM and VOR systems would eliminate both the primary and secondary missed approach fix for ILS 32, ultimately eliminating the ILS approaches at the Airport.
- 3. FFA suggested decommissioning of both the LOM and VOR systems, which would require the ILS 32 missed approach to be a DME fix for the ILS 32, leaving aircraft without RNAV and DME no available approach procedures at the Airport.
- 4. The FAA suggested decommissioning both the LOM and VOR systems, which would no longer allow the field maintenance and avionics shop to certify their equipment used by many university flight schools and private certified flight schools.
- 5. The FAA suggested decommissioning of the LOM and VOR systems would remove the captain upgrade training for area commercial operators, as the Airport instrument approaches are required for captain status.

SECTION 3. Mansfield Lahm Airport is a hub for training in the aviation industry, providing abundant training opportunities for pilots, aircraft maintenance, air traffic control, and other elements of the industry. We view the LOM and VOR systems as essential in order to provide the full spectrum of training and learning opportunities offered by Mansfield Lahm Airport.
