ORDINANCE #

Repealing Chapter 769 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997 concerning prohibiting medical marijuana cultivation, processing, and retail distribution within the City of Mansfield, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Chapter 769 was enacted Nov 7, 2017, by Ordinance # 17-195 and prohibited medical marijuana cultivation, processing, and retail distribution within the City of Mansfield.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That Chapter 769 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997, as amended, be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

769.01 DEFINITIONS

- (a) "Academic medical center" has the same meaning as in Section 4731.297 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (b) "Marijuana" has the same meaning as marihuana as defined in Section 3719.01 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (c) "Medical marijuana" means marijuana that is cultivated, processed, dispensed, tested, possessed, or used for medical purposes.
- (d) "State university" has the same meaning as in Section 3345.011 of the Ohio Revised Code.

-769.02 CULTIVATION, PROCESSING, OR RETAIL DISPENSING OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA PROHIBITED.

- (a) The cultivation, processing, or retail dispensing of medical marijuana within the City of Mansfield is hereby prohibited.
- (b) This section does not prohibit research related to marijuana conducted at a state university, academic medical center, or private research and development organization as part of a research protocol approved by an institutional review board or equivalent entity, if otherwise permitted by State law or rule, or local ordinance.

- 769.99 PENALTY.

Whoever violates Section 769.02 (a) is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 2. That in order to allow for the immediate enforcement of this provision, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Repealing Section 1167.15 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997 concerning prohibiting medical marijuana cultivation, processing, and retail distribution within all zoning districts of the City of Mansfield, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Section 1167.15 was enacted Nov 7, 2017, by Ordinance # 17-196 and prohibited medical marijuana cultivation, processing, and retail distribution within all zoning districts of the City of Mansfield.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Section 1167.15 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997, as amended, be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

1167.15 CULTIVATION, PROCESSING, OR RETAIL DISPENSING OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA PROHIBITED IN ALL DISTRICTS.

- -(a) The cultivation, processing, or retail dispensing of medical marijuana shall be prohibited use in all zoning districts within the City of Mansfield.
- (b) Use of property in violation of this Section shall constitute a nuisance.
- (c) In addition to other penalties provided by law, the Director of Law shall be authorized to institute civil proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin violations of this Section; for monetary damages arising from violations of this Section; and to take all actions necessary to secure enforcement of any injunction and collect upon any damage award, judgment, or fine in contempt levied in relation to a violation of this Section.

That in order to allow for the immediate enforcement of this provision, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants, providing it receives the affirmative vote of twothirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

That by reason of the immediate necessity for submitting a grant application and receiving funding based on bids within deadlines established by the Federal Aviation Administration and the Ohio Department of Transportation, Office of Aviation, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Limiting Adult-Use Cannabis Operators within the City of Mansfield and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2023, voters in Ohio approved State Issue 2, which enacted new Chapter 3780 of the Ohio Revised Code, effective thirty days from the date of the election; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 3780 authorizes and regulates recreational adult-use cannabis in the state of Ohio and

WHEREAS, R.C. 3870.25 authorizes municipal corporations to limit the number of adultuse cannabis operators, as defined in R.C. 3780.01, within city limits and

WHEREAS, the Mansfield City Council finds it to be the best interest of the City to limit the number of adult-use cannabis operators licensed under R.C. Chapter 3780 within the city limits

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. All terms used in this ordinance shall be defined in the same manner as R.C. Chapter 3780 as it pertains to adult-use cannabis. All terms used in this ordinance but not defined in that chapter shall be construed, for purposes of this ordinance, to be consistent with the use of such terms in that chapter.

SECTION 2. Adult-use cannabis operators, which includes adult-use marijuana dispensaries, cultivators, and processors, are hereby limited to no more than 3 (three) operating within the City of Mansfield.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> It is the intent of the City Council to limit the operations described in Section 2 above to the maximum extent permitted by R.C. 3780.25

SECTION 4. That by reason of the immediate necessity for limiting the number of Cannabis Dispensaries in the City of Mansfield, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
